The GRETA project is an innovative educational project funded by Erasmus+ Programme. Yes, the project's name was chosen in tribute to Greta Thunberg, the Swedish teenager who inspired an international movement to fight climate change. The project runs for 24 months and is focused on climate change issues. The GRETA project team develops and implements into practice a range of innovative educational resources for teachers and primary school pupils.



### PROJECT OBJECTIVES

- To develop 42 WebQuests on six climate change topics and implement them with students aged 8-12.
- To train primary school teachers so that they can create and apply their own challenge-based learning resources.
- To develop digital resources to increase the climate literacy of Parents.

### WHAT'S NEW IN THE PROJECT?

The project team has already started the development of 42 WebQuests. WebQuests are innovative educational tools that support independent thinking and problem-solving skills.

The project team has also prepared a project website and a project Facebook page that you can visit.

Organisations from seven EU countries implement the project. In all these countries, In-School Committees for climate awareness were established. These committees comprise primary school teachers, school leaders and parents. They will participate in the project and help project team members to develop high-quality project outputs.
